LOT 1149

A Chinese famille rose export porcelain octagonal plate, Qianlong period, painted with a coastal landscape within a gilt barbed surround and floral rim, width 22.2cm, together with a group of six other export porcelain plates, 18th century, including a pair of famille rose plates, each painted with a flower-filled vase and gourd bottle within fruit and flower spray surrounds, diameter 23cm (rim chips and hairlines).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1149. Octagonal plate - couple of minor chips to the bottom of the rim and a 2.5cm long hairline at about 8 o'clock. Otherwise enamels and gilt are bright and vibrant and plate is in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs.

Pair of plates - one with star crack across the well and a 2.5cm hairline to the rim at 4 o'clock. Couple of tiny nicks to rim and typical light surface scratches and wear. Other plate in generally good condition with a couple of minor nicks to rim, but no cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear.

Yongzheng period plate (flowers) - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear.

Precious vessels plate - generally good condition, typical minor chips to rim, typical light surface scratches and wear.

Peony and lotus plate - minor chips to rim and 5cm long hairline at 3 o'clock, otherwise typical scratches and wear.

Birds and rocks plate - some minor chips to rim, typical surface scratches to glaze, otherwise good.
