### LOT 1082

A small group of Chinese blue and white porcelain, late 19th century, each piece painted with blossoming prunus branches, comprising a pair of vases of shouldered tapering form, height 35.5cm (repaired rims), a ginger jar, height 21.5cm (repaired), with carved and pierced wood cover, a smaller ginger jar, height 16.8cm (drilled hole near base), and a ginger jar and cover, underglaze blue four-character mark of Kangxi to base, height 15.5cm (chipped rim and cover repaired).

### Condition Report

1082. Pair of vases - both with broken and re-glued sections of rims. Otherwise they are in generally good condition with no other significant damage or repairs.

Large ginger jar - numerous cracks across body. Cover in good order.

Paler blue jar - good condition except for a small drilled hole to the side just above the base. Otherwise no chips, cracks or repairs.

Smaller jar and cover - chip to rim and firing crack to shoulder. Otherwise jar is in good order. Cover has been broken into 3 pieces and glued, with some chips to rim.
