A Chinese blue and white porcelain teapot, Ming dynasty, probably Wanli period, the body painted with panels of Buddhistic lions and flowers beneath an overhead handle, height 18cm (lacking cover and spout damaged), together with a small group of other Chinese porcelain (faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1244. Teapot - top of spout damaged and missing cover, otherwise typical surface scratches to glaze.

Larger bowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical surface scratches and wear to glaze.

Blue & white bowl - hairline (4cm long) to rim, minor rim chips, scuffs and wear to glaze.

White saucer - 5cm hairline to rim and small firing crack to rim, few minor rim chips and wear to glaze.

Pot and cover - 2.5cm crack to rim of pot, chips to rim and inner rim of cover. Typical wear and scratches to glaze.
