A Chinese iron red decorated porcelain vase, mark and period of Daoguang, the ovoid body painted with a uniform design of iron red lotus flowerheads and scrolling tendrils, underglaze blue seal mark to base, height 25.5cm (hairline crack, reduced neck and lacking handles), together with a famille rose porcelain vase, Republic period, painted with opposing figural panels reserved against a ground of dense flowers, blue enamelled four-character mark of Qianlong to base, height 22.9cm (extensive repair and losses).

Condition Report

1040. Iron red decorated vase - reduced neck and 4cm hairline to rim. Missing handles. Some wear to iron red painting, particularly to the lappet band just above the foot. The rest of the body in generally good order. Near eggshell vase - badly damaged with significant breaks and some loss to upper section of neck and body, and hairline cracks running into body also. Typical wear to enamels and gilt.
