### LOT 1633

A Clarice Cliff Bizarre Nasturtium pattern cruet set, 1930s, comprising salt, pepper and mustard and cover, together with four Clarice Cliff preserve pots and covers, comprising two of beehive shape in the Pastel Melon pattern, one with double fruit knob in the Autumn Crocus pattern and a striped example of beehive form (some faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

Nasturtium salt - approx 1.5cm long chip to footrim, a few minuscule nicks to edge of pouring hole, no stopper, a few typical minor scratches.

Nasturtium pepper - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, a few very minor scratches to enamels.

Nasturtium mustard - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Crocus - small chip to green inner edge of body where cover sits, the green enamel here is also slightly worn, the cover is in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Pastel Melon with blue and green edged cover - blue enamels of main body misfired in one area, and small chip to wing of bee on cover.

Pastel Melon with pink edged cover - 3cm long vertical haircrack to body, minor flaking to blue enamels of body and small glaze nick to edge of moulded hive entrance, the cover is heavily stained and crazed with a manufacturing blemish by the spoon notch.

Striped - noticeable chip to one wing of bee finial.
