A Jacobus Harlees De Porceleyne Fles (The Porcelain Bottle) Delft charger, circa 1780, painted in shades of blue with a chinoiserie landscape and figures, blue painted monogram and bottle mark to reverse, diameter 35.5cm, together with another late 18th century Dutch Delft blue painted charger, diameter 35.2cm.

Condition Report

Figural dish - approx 4 by 2cm area of professional restoration to upper rim at 7 o'clock, similar at 2 o'clock, the rim circumference overall is totally fritted and there are a lot of places on the upper edge where the blue has been re-touched along the whole circumference. The main body of the plate is in good condition with typical overall light surface scratches and surface wear to the darker blue areas of glaze which are slightly raised.

Other dish - approx 5 by 2cm long area of professional restoration to edge of rim on underside of dish, and a number of smaller areas of professional restoration to upper rim edge, rim circumference overall quite heavily fritted, the upper surface of the dish heavily scratched with numerous areas of wear to the enamels.
