### LOT 1534

A Wedgwood blue dip jasperware candlestick, late 19th century, sprigged with Classical figures, impressed marks to base, height 17.5cm, together with a French porcelain perfume bottle and stopper, a pearlware plate and a Victorian plate mounted blue opaque glass and enamelled hexagonal biscuit barrel, painted with floral spray and insects.

### Condition Report

Candlestick - some light brown staining to the white banded details, may improve with a clean, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Biscuit barrel - the glass body is in good condition. The enamelled decoration is rubbed and worn. The plated mounts are worn.

Scent bottle and stopper - gilding rubbed to neck, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Plate - crazed, 3.5cm long hairline to rim at 3 o'clock.
