### LOT 1021

A small group of Chinese famille rose export porcelain teaware, Qianlong period, including a Mandarin palette baluster cream jug and cover, painted with figures, height 11.5cm, another baluster jug, painted with flowers within pink scale borders, height 11cm, and three various bowls, diameters 14cm, 11cm and 8.7cm, together with a blue and white tea bowl (some faults).

### Condition Report

Mandarin cream jug and cover - minor chip to tip of spout, otherwise in good condition with only minor wear to gilt and enamels.

Other jug - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Largest bowl - Four hairline cracks to rim, ranging from 5cm to 3cm, and a couple of minor rim chips, otherwise decoration is good and vibrant.

Middle sized bowl - small bruise to rim and 2 small bruises to footrim, wear to enamels, otherwise ok.

Smallest bowl - minor rim chips, otherwise ok.

Blue and white bowl - 2 hairline cracks and minor chips to rim.
