LOT 1173

Two Chinese famille rose export porcelain punch bowls, Qianlong period, one painted with flowers, diameter 23.2cm, the other with pavilions in landscape, diameter 23.6cm (both with cracks), together with a pair of Chinese blue and white cylindrical vases, height 20.3cm (restored), two blue and white bowls, painted with prunus, height 8.4cm (lacking covers), and another bowl.

Estimate: £50 - £100

Condition Report

Floral punch bowl - at least 8 vertical haircracks to rim of bowl, longest approx 9cm long, with another haircrack running the diameter of the base with a 3 pronged starcrack alongside, in addition there are 4 small chips to the rim mostly at the starting points of the haircracks, gilding rubbed otherwise typical surface wear.

Punch bowl with pavilions - 3 vertical haircracks to rim, each approx 7.5cm long, extensive chipped fritting to rim circumference, gilding rubbed, otherwise typical surface wear.

Pair cylindrical blue and white vases - one extensively and poorly restored, the other with small filled chip to rim approx 1cm long by 0.2cm wide.

Two blue and white bowls - lacking covers, one with tiny chip to inner rim edge, otherwise ok.

Other bowl - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, surface scratches and light wear.
