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A late 19th century French lacquered brass gorge case petite sonnerie carriage clock by Vieyres & Repingon, with eight day movement striking and repeating the hours and quarters on two bells, the backplate stamped 'Vieyres & Repingon Paris' and numbered '2827', the signed white enamelled dial with black Roman hour numerals, the gorge case with swing handle and bevelled glass panels, two position 'striking' and 'silent' lever to base, height 15.5cm, with winding key. Provenance: formerly the property of Tom Robinson, past chairman of the Antiquarian Horological Society and author of various horological books including 'The Longcase Clock'.

Estimate: £500 - £800

Condition Report

1115. The clock is in generally good condition.

The lacquer to the case has typical wear.

Glass panels appear to be in good condition.

Hinge to back door is good and door closes tightly.

The dial has a crack across the top right corner and other scratches visible under magnification.

The movement winds and runs, the repeat mechanism also striking as it should. Unfortunately, the hour strike mechanism is not working as it should. The key is not original.

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
