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A George III ebonized bracket clock with brass four pillar eight day twin fusee movement striking hours on a bell, the backplate with engraved border and inscribed 'J.H. Borrell London', the 7-inch brass breakarch dial with silvered sunburst boss to arch above a silvered chapter ring and centre, inscribed 'J.H. Borrell London', all cornered with cast and pierced gilt scroll spandrels, the case with moulded cushion top and brass carrying handle, above glazed doors and side panels, on a moulded plinth base and bracket feet, height 46cm, with pendulum, case key and winder (alterations and restoration).

Condition Report

1136. The case and movement are a marriage. There are some obvious signs of this including reinforcements to the brass movement mounts and numerous unused drilled holes to base of case where a movement would have been secured in the past.

Case is in generally good restored condition with typical wear, splits to veneers and replacement feet. The movement and dial are in generally good clean restored order. Dial has some typical wear and minor marks. The movement winds smoothly and runs, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. The stike mechanism also in working order. Pendulum is not original but a later replacement.

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
