A mixed group of English pottery and porcelain, mostly 19th century, including a brown printed plate commemorating [Viscount Clive Attaining His Majority November 5th 1839], diameter 27.5cm, a Chamberlain & Co Worcester floral painted teacup and saucer, a New Hall teabowl and saucer, a Samson Worcester blue scale style teacup and saucer and a Mintons candlestick, height 15.5cm (minor faults).

Condition Report

Commemorative plate - 4 small chips to upper edge of plate and a couple of tiny nicks. Overall surface wear marks. Minor starcrack to centre of underside.

Pair Spode blue printed dishes - one heavily crazed and stained, the other with small chips to underside rim edge of handle.

Chamberlains teacup and saucer - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Very light typical wear.

New Hall teabowl and saucer - extensive manufacturers firing blemishes to saucer and small firing crack to footrim of saucer, otherwise both ok.

Chinese famille rose teabowl - 2 vertical haircracks and small chips to rim, wear to enamels.

Samson teacup and saucer with pseudo fretted square mark - crack to lower handle terminal, some wear to gilding.

Lobed Worcester style teacup and saucer - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Some misfiring to ground colour enamels.

Purple printed jug - heavily crazed with light staining, minor nick to rim.

Jug - crazed with some staining and light wear, a few minor hairlines to rim.

Candlestick - overall finely crazed, tiny nick to edge of foot, a couple of tiny stain spots.

Vase - heavily crazed, otherwise ok.
