Eight assorted gilt lined Royal Worcester cabinet cups and saucers, 1919 to 1930, comprising an example painted with a kingfisher, signed Powell, one with ducks, signed Jas Stinton, one with a peacock, signed Austin, an exotic pheasant, signed by Sedgley, three others with pheasants, each signed by Jas Stinton, and a cup by Jas Stinton, painted with pheasant, matched with a saucer painted with pine by Austin, puce printed marks to bases (minor faults).

Estimate: £700 - £1,000

Condition Report

Each of the saucer wells has typical light surface wear/scratches.

Kingfisher by Powell - saucer heavily crazed overall, cup with some small scattered areas of crazing, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Ducks by Stinton - saucer is cracked with some crazing, cup with areas of crazing, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Peacock by Austin - crazing to circumference of saucer, rim and underside of cup. A few tiny spots of wear to edge of saucer well, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Exotic pheasant by Sedgley - cup is crazed, otherwise both in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

3 Stinton Pheasant examples - one cup heavily crazed. One cup with vertical crack by handle, stained base and areas of crazing. Other cup in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration but with minuscule manufacturing blemish to rim. Each saucer in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Stinton cup with pheasants and matched Austin saucer with pine - areas of crazing to cup, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The saucer is heavily crazed with a small chip to the rim edge.
