### LOT 1528

A pair of pearlware models of a ram and ewe, early 19th century, the ewe with suckling lamb, the ram with resting lamb, on naturalistic mound bases, height 10cm, together with a pair of pearlware figures, modelled as a lady and gentleman carrying chickens, another model of a lamb and two dogs (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £70 - £100

### Condition Report

Ram - missing all the bocage, most of his ears and horns, lamb missing horns and part of left ear. Typical minor losses to applied shredded grass and flowers on base which also has very minor flaking.

Ewe - missing all the bocage, both lamb and ewe with one made up ear, large chip to inner edge of base showing as small chip to outer edge beneath bocage stem, lamb has been broken away from base through legs in a number of places with visible repairs and small losses along the break lines, ewe with similar breaks to each hoof, typical minor losses to applied shredded grass and flowers on base which also has very minor flaking.

Man with chicken - glued repair to neck, multiple chips to hat.

Woman with chicken - 2 small chips to front edge of base, large chip to back of hat brim.

Lamb model - head broken away in 2 large pieces and visibly glued with loss of left ear, small chip to front edge of base.

2 dog models - one broken in two through front paws on base, losses and chips to applied flowers and foliage. Other with tiny chips to nose and minor chips to applied flowers and foliage.
