LOT 1485

A Staffordshire porcelain part service, circa 1800, painted in chinoiserie style with blue rockwork before an iron red fence with pink, green, blue and red flowers and foliage, comprising octagonal teapot and cover with swan finial, teapot stand, jug, slop bowl, sugar bowl, two saucer dishes, six teabowls and six saucers, painted pattern No. 17 (minor faults).

Estimate: £50 - £80

Condition Report

Teapot - overall fine crazing to glaze with light brown staining overall, glazed over manufacturing chip to side edge of spout, tiny nick to inner flange of cover.

Teapot stand - overall fine crazing to glaze with light brown staining and some typical surface wear where teapot has stood.

Sugar bowl - overall fine crazing to glaze with light brown staining.

Jug - overall fine crazing to glaze, not stained.

Slop - overall fine crazing to glaze with light brown staining, branched vertical haircrack to rim.

2 saucer dishes - both with overall fine crazing to the glaze and light brown staining, one with 2 haircracks to rim.

Teabowls - each with overall fine crazing to the glaze and varying degrees of light brown staining, one with vertical haircrack to rim.

Saucers - each with overall fine crazing to the glaze and varying degrees of brown staining, 2 with short haircrack to rim, one with fine haircrack running approx halfway round well.

Overall the enamels display hardly any wear.
