A Meissen circular dish, circa 1740, painted in Imari style after a Japanese original, probably by Kretschmar, in underglaze blue, iron red, green and gilding, with a central vase of flowers, flanked by blossom, within a gilt overlaid blue frame, the rim with three floral panels separated by blue framing, the rim underside with three floral branches, crossed swords and 'K' mark in underglaze blue, impressed '22' and incised '4' to edge of footrim, diameter 37.5cm.

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

The dish is fundamentally in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

There are overall scratches to the glaze, some deeper than others, and significant wear to the glaze (probably due to stacking) to the rim underside.

The enamels and gilding display light typical wear, particularly to the gilding of the rim.

The rim has some minor glaze blemishes/bubbles - a manufacturing issue. Another manufacturing issue is the fact the dish overall is a slightly uneven shape and does not sit flat on its foot - please see the extra images on our website using the zoom function, image 6 in particular shows the uneven shape.
