### LOT 1507

A small group of Worcester porcelain, late 19th and early 20th century, comprising a pair of two-handled vases, decorated with peacocks amidst pine, height 12cm, a figure of John Bull, decorated in shot enamels, model No. 851, a tusk jug, a bamboo pot and cover, a pair of foliate vases, height 13.5cm, and a figural spill vase (faults and restoration).

Estimate: £60 - £100

### Condition Report

Pair peacock vases - one with small chip to inner rim edge of neck, other is badly cracked.

John Bull - broken through neck and visibly glued with minor restoration to hat brim.

Pot and cover - one handle glued, minute nick to cover.

Tusk jug - minute nick to gilt rim.

Two foliate vases - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Figural spill - chipping to top rim edge of spill holder and some relief details, small nick to toes of right foot and little finger of left hand.
