LOT 625

A Victorian gold and silver set, emerald and diamond necklace, last quarter of the 19th century, the front of graduated scroll and foliate pierced form, mounted with old mine and rose cut diamonds with rectangular and step cut emeralds, with a row of eleven graduated emerald and diamond clusters, otherwise with an old mine and rose cut diamond bar link chain on a diamond set cluster clasp, total weight 90g, total diamond weight approx 15.00-17.00ct, total emerald weight approx 7.00-8.00ct, length 42cm, with a later Garrard & Co case.

Estimate: £20,000 - £30,000

Condition Report

All carat weights and gradings are for guidance only, they are estimations and limited by the jewellery settings.

Total diamond weight approx 15.00-17.00ct, total emerald weight approx 7.00-8.00ct.

Principal diamond weights approx:

Clasp principal stone (closed back) - 1.10-1.20ct

Front central stone - 1.70-1.80ct

Principal stones above and below front central stone - 0.70ct and 0.80ct.

The large diamonds are generally SI clarity, the diamonds across the piece are of a similar clarity. The colours range from H/I to L/M across the piece. The large diamond to the clasp approx L/M colour.

The emeralds are of medium to rich colour saturation and generally look to be fairly clear stones.

There is a lead solder repair at the back above the lower large diamond above the central front cluster.

The diamond bar link construction to the backs of the two links immediately before the graduating scrolls differ from the open back bar link structure of the diamond links at the back of the collar.
