A graduated set of six Chinese blue and white export porcelain oval meat dishes, late Qianlong/early Jiaqing period, each painted with pavilions, figures and trees in a coastal landscape, each shaped rim with feathered border, copied from a standard English creamware design, lengths 26.4cm, 30.4cm, 34.5cm, 38.3cm, 43cm and 47.3cm. ### Condition Report

1150. All six dishes in very good clean condition with no significant damage and no repairs. All with typical minor surface scratches and wear to glaze, but nothing of any real significance. Good quality painting is bright and vibrant. Stilt marks visible to front of each dish where it was supported in the kiln.
