A Chinese famille rose porcelain vase, mid-19th century, the shouldered ovoid body and flared neck painted with opposing figural scenes reserved against a dense flower ground, with applied chalong to shoulders and Buddhist lion handles, height 42.5cm (damaged and repaired), together with a Chinese Canton famille rose porcelain vase, mid-19th century, painted and gilt with dragons and vapours, height 45cm (repaired neck, drilled base and converted to a table lamp).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

1037. Metal table lamp mounts to top and metal and wood mount to base are obscuring some areas of vase. From what is visible, there are two minor chips to outside corners of rim. The lower section of the vase has been broken all the way round, and restored with some overpainting. The rest of the vase is in generally good order with good bright enamels.
