A Chinese famille rose export porcelain teapot and cover, Qianlong period, the globular body painted with opposing figural scenes within trellis borders, fitted with a replacement silver spout, height 16.5cm, together with a small group of similar teaware, comprising two teabowls, two saucers and a cover (some faults).

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

1052. Teapot - hairline cracks to cover and typical wear to enamels and gilt teapot body has a replacement silver spout, otherwise in good condition with typical light surface scratches and wear.

Saucer - broken and re-glued section of rim (3.3cm x 5cm), few minor rim chips and typical light surface scratches and wear.

Teabowl 1 - small chip to rim and small hairline to rim (1.8cm long), typical light surface scratches and wear.

Teabowl 2 - small chip to rim and 0.8cm long hairline, otherwise typical light wear.

Smaller saucer - two small hairlines to rim (1cm x 0.5cm long) and typical wear to enamels.

The small cover/stand is cracked (2.5cm long) and typical light wear.
