A collection of Chinese export porcelain, Kangxi period and later Qing dynasty, including two famille rose globular teapots and covers, Qianlong period, height 12.4cm and 13cm, a 'clobbered' blue and white circular bowl, diameter 25.7cm, an Imari jug, height 13.5cm, and assorted teabowls and saucers (faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1202. Figural teapot - cracked across body, chipped rim of cover and typical wear.

Floral teapot - chipped end of spout, crack across base and some wear to enamels.

Basin - 9cm crack to rim and some small chips to rim, some wear to decoration.

Famille rose slop bowl - chip to rim and fritting to rim. Some wear to enamels.

Famille rose conical bowl - good condition.

Imari jug - broken into many pieces and repaired, no lid.

All other pieces with either chips, cracks or repairs.
