LOT 350

A William III silver tankard, the slightly tapered cylindrical body engraved with an armorial above a spiral fluted basal band, flanked by a scroll handle engraved with another armorial and initialled 'M' over 'I-B', all beneath a domed hinged lid with foliate scroll thumbpiece, London 1695, maker's mark 'JS' in monogram within a wreath, weight 695.5g, height 16.5cm. Note: the unattributed maker's mark is recorded on page 142 of 'Jackson's English Goldsmiths and their Marks'.

Estimate: £1,000 - £1,500

Condition Report

350. The tankard is in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs.

Professional repair to hinge of tappit lid.

One small dent to the spiral reeding on the body and other very minor dents/nicks to body. There are a few dents to the curve of the scroll handle.

Small 2mm tear/split to the shaped front rim section of the lid but nothing too significant.

Otherwise body and lid with typical light surface scratches and wear commensurate with age.

Armoial is crisply engraved.

Good clear hallmarks on the body to the right of the handle and part marks to cover (rubbed but readable) and to the handle.
