An early Victorian harlequin silver four-piece tea set, each piece of lobed melon form with scroll handles and anthemion moulded feet, comprising teapot and sugar bowl, London 1839 by William Hewitt, milk jug, London 1839 by J.E. Terrey & Co, and hot water pot, London 1841 by Joseph & Albert Savory, height of hot water pot 24.5cm, total weight 2258.5g. ### Condition Report

330. All pieces with typical surface scratches and wear and all engraved with initial 'N'.

Teapot - numerous small dents to body, spout and handle. Handle a little loose. Otherwise okay with readable hallmarks.

Hot water pot - few minor dents to body and handle, otherwise in generally good order. Good clear hallmarks.

Milk jug - numerous dents around the body. Good clear hallmarks.

Sugar bowl - couple of small dents to body, otherwise good. Marks slightly rubbed.
