A rare Mortlake stoneware hunting jug, probably Sanders, circa 1780-90, the ovoid body sprigged with a rectangular Punch Party plaque beneath the spout, above hounds and flanked by trees, a stag, a figure on horseback and a figure walking with a long staff, the rilled neck with plated mount, unmarked, height 18cm.

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

Overall the jug is in good condition with no chips or restoration.

There is a curved haircrack/firing crack to the edge of the footrim almost beneath the sprigged motif of the 3 running dogs - this haircrack is approx 4cm in total length and approx 2.5cm at its widest point from end to end. One small sprigged motif of foliage has a minor chip to it.

The plated rim has worn to the base metal.
