A cased set of twelve Sèvres style French porcelain plates, late 19th/early 20th century, each painted by Thuillier, signed, with a different pastoral scene of a couple within a cobalt blue rim gilt with anthemion amidst scrollwork, pseudo red, blue and green printed Sèvres 'Chateau Des Tuileries' marks to bases and incised numerals, diameter 22.7cm, held within a purple velvet lined and cushioned case (one plate with area of restoration to rim, case worn and tired).

Estimate: £600 - £800

Condition Report

11 of the plates are in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

One of the plates has an area of restoration to the rim at 9 o'clock where a 1.5cm long by 2cm wide triangular shaped section has been broken out and restored back - the restoration was obviously executed some time ago as it has yellowed with age and the area is more extensive than the damage would suggest is needed, I would also suggest a better result could be achieved with modern day methods by a more experienced restorer.

Each of the plates has very good gilding and enamels with no noticeable wear or scratches.

The case overall is in very poor condition with peeling to its exterior, staining, splitting and losses; it's locking mechanism has been broken. The case interior is tired and dirty with light staining but is not so terrible.
