### LOT 1551

A pair of Minton Kedleston ewers, 1890s, painted by J.E. Dean, signed, with titled oval panels of Windsor Castle and Kenilworth Castle within gilt frames against a cobalt blue ground, the high loop handles with satyr terminals, gilt printed and puce painted marks to bases, height 29cm (minor faults).

### Condition Report

Windsor Castle - fine crazing to glaze with some very minor staining to square foot. The square foot also has two fine haircracks to the underside very slightly encroaching vertically onto side edges, the circular foot has 3 similar fine haircracks emanating from the central hole visible to the underside. The handle has been broken away and glued above the satyr mask and through the cobalt blue section of rim below the upper handle terminal.

Kenilworth Castle - overall fine crazing to glaze with some very minor and light brown staining to the foot which has a couple of very fine haircracks emanating from the central bolt.

Both ewers are bolted, the Windsor Castle example has a small bolt hidden inside the stem of the foot, the Kenilworth Castle example has a larger more visible bolt to the base of the circular section of the foot.
