LOT 1533

A Daniel porcelain part service, circa 1825, painted in pattern No. 4044 with floral panels within gilt scroll and foliate framing, against a cobalt blue ground, comprising six teacups and saucers of Old English shape, teapot stand, two plates, diameter 23.5cm, sucrier and cover and jug, together with a small group of other English porcelain, including two Imari painted plates and a Worcester teabowl with matched saucer (minor faults).

Condition Report

PLEASE NOTE THIS IS ONLY A PARTIAL CONDITION REPORT DETAILING THE DANIEL PORCELAIN WARES INCLUDED IN THE LOT;

Cups - 3 in good condition, one lightly crazed but ok, one with 2 restored breaks to handle, one with vertical crack running by handle.

Jug - haircrack through base.

Saucers - 4 in good condition, one with very faint starcrack to well, one badly cracked.

Sucrier and cover - overall fine crazing to glaze, 2 very small and faint starcracks to base, very fine and indistinct haircrack to cover emanating from knob - approx 2cm long.

Teapot stand - small typical areas of wear to cavetto.

2 plates - both with noticeable surface wear/scratches to well and cavetto, otherwise ok.

Overall the gilding and enamelling are in generally good condition with no significant wear or losses.

ADDED ON 9TH JANUARY;

Pair of Japan pattern plates - the first has a 4cm long horizontal stained firing crack to the upper section of the central well, very visible from the front and less so from the back, the other has two 2.5cm long haircracks to the rim which are mostly noticeable to the underside. Both plates have pitting to the glaze and typical rubbing/wear to the gilding commensurate with age and use.
