LOT 1544

A Derby porcelain part service, early 19th century, pattern No. 37, gilt with foliate scrollwork against a pale orange ground, comprising teapot, cover and stand, sucrier and cover, jug, slop bowl, two plates, diameter 22.3cm, eight teacups, nine coffee cans and ten saucers, iron red painted marks to bases (some faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

Teapot - fine crazing to glaze overall, glued repair to tip of spout, cover ok.

Teapot stand - finely crazed, otherwise ok.

Jug - finely crazed, otherwise ok.

Sucrier - finely crazed, glued repair to knob of cover, 2 short haircracks to rim edge of cover.

Slop - finely crazed, otherwise ok.

Two plates - both finely crazed, one with tiny nick to rim edge, other with 2 minor spots of staining to centre.

Saucers - each finely crazed with some wear to central gilt circle where cup or can would sit, 6 generally otherwise ok, 2 with minor haircracks, 1 with more significant haircracks, 1 badly cracked.

Teacups - 5 generally ok but finely crazed and with rubbing to gilt rim, 1 with fine crazing and repaired handle, 1 badly cracked and finely crazed, 1 finely crazed with faint hairlines.

Coffee cans - each finely crazed, 3 lightly stained to base interior but generally ok, 1 badly cracked and repaired, 1 stained and cracked with repaired handle, 1 with short firing crack to rim, 1 with glued handle, others ok.
