## LOT 1548

A Meissen schneeballen écuelle and cover, late 19th century, of circular shape, densely applied with white flowerheads, relief roses and foliage in gilt and green, surmounted by yellow birds, crossed swords mark in underglaze blue to base, height 12cm (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £80 - £120

## Condition Report

Base - each yellow bird with badly chipped or missing tail and beak, one foliage stem missing majority of pieces, other two foliage stems missing sections, chips and losses to applied roses, the white flowerheads generally in good condition, as is the bowl body itself.

Cover - broken into 2 large and 2 smaller pieces and visibly glued with small losses along the break lines and a small section of the inner flange missing, the handle is missing the gilt end of the main branch, the bird finial is badly chipped to the tail and beak and sections of stem are missing with small chips to the applied roses.
