An early 19th century percussion wildfowl sporting gun by T. North, Southton, probably Thomas North of Southampton, with part-round and part-octagonal barrel, barrel length 108cm, indistinctly detailed with maker's name and inset proof tablet, full-stocked with foliate engraved lock and hammer, detailed with a hunting dog with birds in flight, chequered grips and brass-tipped ramrod.

Condition Report

3035. Difficult to assess condition of bore, appears quite rusty. Diameter of bore is approx 22mm. The half and full action cocks and seems strong. No visible cracks to stock or woodwork, though does have some heavy bruising and scratches. No visible proof marks.
