A Chinese 'clobbered' blue and white porcelain vase and cover, mark of Chenghua but Kangxi period and later, the baluster body and domed cover painted in underglaze blue with flowers, late embellished in polychrome and gilt with further flowers, height 19.5cm (faults), together with a famille verte blue ground rouleau vase, Kangxi style but 19th century, painted with figural scenes, height 23.5cm (repaired), and a Canton famille rose bowl, mid-19th century, typically painted with figures, birds and flowers, diameter 23.5cm (chipped and cracked).

Condition Report

1034. Clobbered vase and cover - chip and repair to rim with minor loss/chip at the break point. Vertical hairline running down from the chip (approx 8.5cm in length), another hairline crack to rim running vertically down most of the body. Cover with missing finial and numerous chips to rim.

Rouleau vase - chipped section to rim (approx 1cm x 4cm), approx half of rim broken out in two pieces and re-glued, also large section of one side of body broken out and re-glued (approx 9.5cm x 9cm).

Bowl - large chip to rim (approx 0.8cm x 3cm). Hairline crack to rim and typical wear to enamels and gilt.
