A group of Chinese export porcelain teaware, 18th century, including a set of four famille rose saucers, Yongzheng period, painted with floral panels, diameters 11.5cm, a famille rose saucer, Qianlong period, painted and gilt with a figural scene, diameter 11.4cm, a blue and white cup and two teabowls (minor faults). Provenance: the property of a West Sussex private collector.

Condition Report

1036. Four saucers - all with typical light surface scratches and wear to gilt and enamels, three with small hairlines to rim, one with small chip to rim and one in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs.

Figural saucer - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical wear to gilt and enamels.

Yongzheng famille rose saucer - two repaired sections to rim (5cm x 1.5cm, and 2.7cm x 0.8cm), also small hairline to rim and typical wear to enamels.

Famille rose teabowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light wear to enamels and gilt rim.

Smaller teabowl - small chip to rim, otherwise good condition.

Blue and white cup - good condition, tiny chip to footrim.
