A collection of Japanese pottery, Meiji period and later, including a Kutani porcelain goblet, height 13cm, a pair of Satsuma vases, height 12.2cm, and two other Satsuma vases, together with a Japanese cloisonné vase, Meiji period, decorated with swallows on a wisteria branch against a red ground, height 18cm (faults).

Condition Report

1159. Kutani cup - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical minor wear.
Cloisonne vase - small chip to body, slightly misshapen foot, otherwise ok.
Satsuma vase - chip to rim and 4cm hairline crack to rim, typical light crazing and wear.
Satsuma baluster vase - small chip to rim. Three hairlines to rim. Typical light crazing and wear.
Kutani beaker and cover - good condition, no chips, cracks or rim. Light wear to gilt.
Pair of Satsuma vases - 1) in good condition, light crazing, typical wear to enamels and gilt. 2) chip to footrim, hairline crack to body, typical light crazing and wear.
Pair of Kutani vases - good condition, light wear to painting and gilt.
Teapot - tiny chip to tip of spout, restored finial, light crazing, surface scratches and wear, light staining.
Single Kutani vase - wear to gilt and enamels, otherwise ok.
Imari gourd vase - good condition, typical wear.
Large Imari bowl - chip to rim, small hairline and wear to gilt and enamels.
Small Imari vase - crack to body
Kutani bowl - repaired chip and small hairline to rim, typical wear to gilt and enamels
Kutani plate - good condition, wear to gilt
Noritake vase - hairline to rim
3 Imari dishes and bowl - all with either rim chips or hairlines
Large table lamp vase - typical crazing, wear to gilt and a bit dirty and dusty.
