A pair of Chinese Canton famille rose porcelain vases, mid-19th century, each shouldered body and flared neck painted with opposing figural panels, reserved against a ground of dense flowerheads, applied with Buddhist lion cub handles and chilong to shoulders, height 34.5cm (one cracked).

Estimate: £250 - £350

Condition Report

1030 - Vase 1 - Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Small nick to back of one of the chilong on the shoulder of the vase. Small chip to underside of the frill edge at the bottom of the neck. Small glaze loss/shallow chip to one frill on rim. Otherwise good vibrant colours with typical minor surface scratches and wear to glaze, enamels and gilt.

Vase 2 - Approximately 12cm hairline crack to rim. Hairline crack running up one side of the vase from the footrim to the shoulder (approximately 23cm long). Star crack to base. Otherwise good vibrant colours with typical minor surface scratches and wear to glaze, enamels and gilt.
