LOT 1010

A Chinese famille rose porcelain teapot and cover, late Qing dynasty, of hexagonal form, painted with grasshoppers and flowers, fitted with a pair of brass overhead swing handles, unmarked, height including handle 19.4cm.

Estimate: £100 - £200

Condition Report

1010 - Good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. Good vibrant enamels. Typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels, gilt and glaze but nothing significant. The front two of the handle mounting screws are missing and being held in place by string. Four faint hairlines to rim (two vertical approx 1.8cm long and two diagonal approx 1cm and 1.4cm long). There are also two upper corners which have small horizontal firing cracks. Each of these firing cracks are approx 1.3cm long. The firing crack to the back of the teapot has a small faint hairline running off it at each side culminating in an approx 4cm long horizontal hairline. Please see extra images of these issues.
