### LOT 1049

A Chinese flambé glazed meiping, mark of Qianlong but probably later Qing dynasty, the baluster body covered in a streaky lavender and pale blue glaze, impressed seal mark to base, height 28.5cm (firing crack to footrim).

Estimate: £400 - £600

### Condition Report

1049 - Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light crazing and minor surface scratches to glaze visible under magnification. Some glaze hairlines around the base of the vase and a few minor nicks to glaze edge near base. Firing crack across footrim (approx 5cm long), only visible to inside of footrim. Small section of footrim (approx 3cm long) has been slightly ground down probably when reducing overlapping glaze.

Diameter of top 4.4cm.

Inner aperture of mouth 2.1cm.
