## Condition Report

1230. The bowl has been extensively restored to a very good professional standard. The bowl has been broken in half and two 'u' shaped sections broken out (each appr 7.5cm x 15cm). On very close inspection in person, and also in the images online, the shadow of the breaks can be seen, but the overpainting/restoration has been very well executed, leaving a really good looking decorative bowl.
