A pair of graduated Worcester circular bowls, circa 1765-70, painted in Mandarin style with standing Chinese figures by a tree, two figures holding a bird, the rim interiors with a cell border, diameters 15.5cm and 12.3cm, together with two Worcester coffee cups, painted with Chinese figures in the Boy In the Window and Conjuror patterns, and a Chinese famille rose exportware mug, Qianlong period, with replacement metal handle, height 13.5cm (faults). Provenance: the property of Michael Godfrey.

Condition Report

Large bowl - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, quite heavily scratched to interior, very light typical wear/scratches to exterior.

Small bowl - small area of restoration to rim, very heavily scratched to interior, lighter typical wear/scratches to exterior with some very minor staining.

Coffee cup with scalloped rim - vertical crack to body by handle which then runs horizontally beneath the handle and has some poor quality restoration over it to the interior.

Other coffee cup - minor haircrack beneath lower handle terminal and two very short and indistinct vertical haircracks to rim.

Chinese mug - curve shaped haircrack to lower body, replacement metal handle, top rim edge extensively chipped and the gilding here completely worn.
