### LOT 1432

A Caughley fluted teabowl and saucer, circa 1775, decorated in blue and gilt with scattered floral sprigs around a central medallion beneath a dot and star border to the rim, diameter of saucer 14cm, together with a similarly decorated saucer, blue painted open crescent mark to base, diameter 14.2cm, a leaf moulded jug with mask spout, height 16.8cm (restored), another teabowl (fault) and a blue ground saucer with floral panels attributed to James Giles, diameter 11.8cm. Provenance: the property of Michael Godfrey.

Estimate: £70 - £100

### Condition Report

Caughley teabowl and saucer - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, very light wear to decoration.

Similar saucer - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Similar teabowl - triangular shaped section broken away from the side but available with the lot, alongside the break is a vertical haircrack.

Blue ground saucer - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Jug - a crack runs along one side of the spout, underneath the spout and horizontally around the neck of the jug to the upper handle terminal - the length of the crack has stabilizing restoration. Otherwise gilding and enamels good.
