A Worcester King of Prussia cylindrical mug, circa 1757, printed in black after Robert Hancock with a titled half-length portrait of Frederick II of Prussia opposing Fame blowing trumpets, flanking a design of pennants and military trophies, signed amidst the print with 'RH' monogram and anchor rebus for Richard Holdship, height 8.5cm (minor faults), together with a Worcester black printed L'Amour saucer and matched Classical Ruins teabowl. Mug - two tadpole shaped chips to footrim both approx 2cm long, and some minor fritting to footrim, minor curve shaped haircrack to glaze on inner rim of mug by handle. Some light scratches to exterior.

Saucer - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Teabowl - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
