### LOT 1490

A mixed group of English porcelain, mostly plates, 19th century, including a pair of Spode in pattern No. 2004, painted to the centre with flower sprays within a lilac ground rim moulded and painted with flowers, diameter 21.3cm, a pair of Coalport plates with a black ground Church Gresley type pattern, diameter 23.5cm, a Coalport soup plate, painted in Paris style probably in London, and a Coalport Feltspar plate with blue flowerheads moulded to the rim (faults and restoration).  
Provenance: the property of Donald Church.

### Condition Report

Paris style Coalport plate with small filled chip to rim approx 1.5 by 1cm.

Two Church Gresley type plates - one with wear to gilding.

Coalport Feltspar plate - heavily crazed.

Plate with moulded rim painted with green foliage - gilding rubbed.

Two plates with gilt, purple and red flowers and foliage to the rim - both heavily crazed and stained.

Floral and fruit painted plate with gilt enriched moulded beige rim - crazed and stained.

Seven hexagonal blue rimmed plates - each badly cracked, half also with poor restoration.

Four named botanical plates - one with haircrack.

Apricot ground plate - badly cracked.

Flower shaped plate - crazed with wear to cavetto.

Oblong dish with blue flowers - small chip to underside rim edge.

Square two handled dish - gilding rubbed.

Coffee cup - glued chip to outer rim edge, crazed.

Other items in lot generally in good condition with typical wear/scratches commensurate with age and use.
