A Coalport Dulong moulded part service, circa 1820, painted in Meissen style with floral sprays, comprising a large oval platter, length 48cm, an oval plate, length 33cm, four oval dishes, a single-handled quatrefoil dish, eleven plates and two footed navette shaped bowls, together with a large Coalport meat dish with blind moulded flowerhead rim, painted in purple and yellow with floral sprays, length 52cm, a Derby purple floral painted part service, a similar Flight, Barr & Barr plate and a small group of other 19th century porcelain (faults). Provenance: the property of Donald Church.

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

Dulong pieces:

Large oval platter - chip to rim, heavily worn with some staining.

Small oval platter - generally ok.

4 oval dishes - each stained and crazed.

Single handled dish - generally ok.

5 plates generally ok with light staining, one plate ok but with more staining, one plate chipped to rim underside, 4 plates heavily crazed with staining.

Navette bowls - one generally ok with light staining and minor flat chip to footrim, the other ok but heavily worn to the interior.

Derby pieces:

Large platter - small chip to upper rim edge at one end, very worn surface and some staining.

Diamond shaped dish - crazed and stained with small chip to underside rim edge.

2 circular dishes - both with stained crazing.

Soup plate - stained crazing.

6 plates - each heavily crazed with varying degrees of staining, one also has haircracks and one has a chip to the rim.

Other Pieces:

Rectangular dish with pink roses - crazed with light staining.

2 diamond shaped dishes - generally ok.

Pair green floral Derby plates - each with haircrack.

New Hall type plate - haircrack.

FBB plate - restored filled chips to rim, scratched, gilt rim rubbed.
