A Derby porcelain named view teacup and saucer, early 19th century, the cup painted with 'Near Brighton' within a gilt cartouche frame against a gilt overlaid salmon pink ground, the matching saucer with a view of abbey ruins, red painted marks to bases, diameter of saucer 13.5cm, together with a Billingsley Mansfield yellow ground coffee can (restored), a Chamberlains Worcester coffee cup and saucer, two early 19th century Continental saucers and a small group of other similar wares (faults). Provenance: the property of Donald Church.

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

Derby named view teacup and saucer - both pieces in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, gilding and enamels good with only a few tiny scratches.

Yellow ground coffee can - broken into a number of large pieces and extensively restored with a significant amount of repainting and regilding.

Chamberlains cup and saucer - saucer has restored chip to rim and haircrack, firing crack to lower handle terminal and gilt rim of cup rubbed.

2 Continental saucers - both in good condition overall.

Saucer with central panel of fisherman - gilding rubbed, otherwise ok.

BFB orange rim plate - generally in good condition with minor typical wear.

2 orange ground saucers - both rivet repaired.

Chamberlains plate - badly cracked with glued repair, heavily crazed.
