### LOT 1204

A Japanese Satsuma earthenware kettle and cover, Meiji period, of circular form, painted and gilt with figural panels and simulated brocade, black and gilt signature to base, diameter 9.5cm, together with a small group of other Satsuma, comprising a circular dish, diameter 18.5cm, a circular bowl, diameter 18.2cm (hairline to rim), and two small vases (minor faults).

Estimate: £100 - £150

### Condition Report

1204. Kettle - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light crazing. Typical minor wear to gilt and enamels. More pronounced wear to gilt on underside. Metal on handle unravelling.

Vase - minor restoration and retouching to rim. Crazing and wear to glaze and enamels.

Dish - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light crazing and wear to gilt and enamels.

Hexagonal pot - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light wear to gilt and enamels.

Bowl - small/faint hairline crack to rim, otherwise generally ok with typical crazing to glaze. Slight staining visible to centre. Typical wear to gilt and enamels.
