LOT 1242

A George III mahogany circular wall clock with eight day single fusee movement, the repainted 12-inch circular dial with black Roman hour numerals and inscribed 'Willm Bristow London', within a circular moulded surround with cast brass bezel and convex glass, case diameter 35cm. Note: William George Bristow is a recorded clockmaker working in London circa 1790-1820.

Estimate: £250 - £350

Condition Report

1242. The wall timepiece is in generally good condition with typical nicks and scuffs to the surround. The box has scuffs and nicks, and also chips to moulding around the trap door. Side door appears to have been re-hinged. Convex glass and cast bezel in good order (later re-plastered). One peg to case missing, others of random shape. Dial is re-painted. Movement appears to be in good order and winds smoothly but unfortunately the spring on the pendulum is broken so unable to check whether it runs fully. The clock does have a pendulum and a winding key, but no case key for the trap door to underside.

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
