A mixed group of mostly Worcester Queen Charlotte pattern wares, circa 1780, comprising teapot and cover, height 13cm, sparrow beak jug, coffee cup and two saucers, two bowls, diameters 10.5cm and 12cm, dish with shaped rim, diameter 15cm, two saucer dishes, diameters 14.8cm and 17cm, cover and stand, diameter 18.5cm, the majority with underglaze blue fretted square marks to bases (minor faults).

Condition Report

Teapot and cover - floral finial of cover reattached with a screw fitting and there is some restoration to the flower. Pot itself in good condition overall with some typical light surface scratches.

Jug - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, some black fritting around footrim - a manufacturing issue.

Coffee cup - minute nick to top rim edge.

Two saucers - both in good condition overall with light typical wear.

Larger bowl - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, gilt rim rubbed.

Smaller bowl - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, gilt rim rubbed.

Stand - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Larger saucer dish - marked as Barr Worcester, in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Smaller saucer dish - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, gilt rim rubbed, light surface scratches.

Dish with shaped rim - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Cover - 2 minor nicks to rim edge, floral knob restored.
