A slipware pottery scraffito jug, early 19th century, incised with naive images of a bird, zebra and leopard above trees beneath two suns and stars, the name 'John Trennsick' to the shoulders of the jug and handle, unmarked, height 16cm (faults).

Condition Report

There is 3cm long by 1.5cm deep flat chip to the outer edge of the neck rim above the area where the name is inscribed, a small area of slip is missing below this main chip and alongside amidst the leaf decoration. There is a crack running vertically from the neck rim alongside the edge of the upper handle terminal, it branches off beneath the upper handle terminal, a small area of slip is missing along the first part of the crack.

There is a crack to the middle of the handle, and the lower handle terminal is missing some slip.

Some loss of slip around the outer base edge of the foot.

Overall typical fine crazing to the glaze.
