### LOT 1549

A Worcester scale blue ground circular dish, circa 1765-75, painted with floral panels within gilt scroll cartouche frames, with scalloped rim, underglaze blue fretted square mark to base, diameter 21.3cm, together with a small group of similarly painted Worcester, comprising an hexagonal teapot stand, two plates, diameters 21cm and 22.7cm, an ovoid jar and cover, height 14cm, a cover and a coffee cup, and a blue ground Worcester saucer dish with central floral panel, underglaze blue fretted square mark to base, diameter 22.5cm (faults and restoration). Provenance: the property of Michael Godfrey.

Estimate: £70 - £100

### Condition Report

Largest scale blue ground plate - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Light surface scratches/wear.

Other two scale blue ground plates - first in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, typical light surface wear/scratches. The second is extensively professionally restored.

Solid blue ground plate - small area of professional restoration to rim, some wear and surface scratches.

Teapot stand - two vertical cracks to moulded rim, gilding rubbed, light surface scratches.

Coffee cup - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Some black pitting/adhesions to glaze.

Cover - long curved haircrack emanating from spoon notch which also has a small chip to its edge, small nicks to knob.

Jar and cover - some deep scratches to one main bird panel with other minor typical surface scratches wear overall, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The cover is restored.
