### LOT 1542

A Worcester Parrot Pecking Fruit blue printed mug, circa 1770-85, hatched crescent mark to base, height 11.8cm, three Caughley Mother and Child coffee cups, a Derby teabowl, a Flight Worcester teabowl and a small group of other mostly late 18th/early 19th century pottery, including a feather-edged pearlware plate, painted with a chinoiserie figure holding a parasol, diameter 25cm (faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

Parrot mug - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, a couple of tiny stain spots.

3 Caughley cups - each in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Derby teabowl - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Flight Worcester teabowl - small chipping to top rim edge, wear to interior.

Teapot - 3 small chips to rim edge of cover, minor nicks to knob of cover, spout has been broken away from main body and glued back into position.

Famille rose cup - pottery, crack to lower handle terminal, crazing to glaze, tiny glaze nicks to top rim edge and one to footrim.

Small bowl - cracked, crazed and badly stained.

Feather edge plate man with parasol - scratched and a bit stained but generally ok.

Other similar plate - crack and small chip to rim, crazed.

Octagonal plate - crack and 2 small chips to rim edge, surface wear.

Willow pattern plate - heavily crazed and stained, small chip to underside rim edge.

Pair creamware plates - one with small chip to upper rim edge, other badly cracked and stained with small chip.

Pierced rim plate - crazed with light staining, surface wear.

Fisherman and Cormorant plate - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, some light surface wear.
